President's Report

Firstly, many thanks to Vice President Karl Stratton for holding the fort during the month of May whilst I was away overseas, and for chairing the committee meetings on 20 May and the next one on 15 July when I will be away again.

Course Superintendent

Our Course Superintendent Ryan Blackbourn, who started with the Club in February, has settled in well and is doing a great job on the course, helped as always by the tremendous efforts of our course volunteers. In particular our new John Deere greens mower is proving a valuable asset in delivering greens of excellent playing quality. The new Trimax fairway mower is also performing well. In addition to his on-course work, Ryan is also undertaking turf management studies and is progressing very well on that front.

Committee

Disappointingly, the secretary position has remained vacant all year with no-one stepping forward into the role. In a few months it will be time to seek nominations for the committee for 2025, with several executive positions likely to be open. Please consider if you have abilities in the administration area to offer the Club, and if so maybe put your name forward ahead of the AGM in December. If some key roles are not filled at the AGM, the new committee may have no option but to look to out-source such roles at additional cost to the Club - which might have implications for subscription levels.

It was pleasing to welcome Rachelle Quin onto the committee in the role of Ladies Club Captain at the last meeting on 17 June.

The Club's Rules are to be reviewed shortly in light of requirements necessitated by regulatory changes to the Incorporated Societies Act.

Committee business continues to be largely routine, but with several issues demanding special attention from time to time. Most recently, the tee-off arrangements for 18-hole ladies on Club Day Saturdays has come under the spotlight. Both the main committee and match committee are keen to promote the "One Club" concept, with everyone (ladies and men) teeing off from the 1st tee and entering the haggle on Club Day. The online tee booking facility is available and working well.

Junior Golf

Esther White and Terry Butler are to be commended for their great work in establishing and running our successful Junior Golf programme, obtaining some sponsorship and installing Purple tee signage. Participating numbers are very encouraging.

Projects

As always there are a number of improvement projects on the go, both on and off the course, along with the usual course maintenance activities:

- Tree felling and firewood cutting (thanks re hard work on the latter to Jim Newlove, Greg Jans and Peter Pearce)

- Loading of firewood onto trailer and sale, delivering valuable income to the Club (thanks mainly to John Rayner and Robin Broadmore)
- Major hedge trimming last Thursday by contractor Richard Dreaver
- Completion of the new pathway along the low side of the 4th fairway (thanks mainly to Greg Jans)
- Planting out of a new garden alongside the reservoir rocks on the 5th hole (thanks mainly to the efforts of Lee Mather, David Butler, Jim Newlove and yours truly)
- Painting of the clubhouse (after about 20 years): now 90% complete (thanks mainly to the masking-up efforts of a few of us and the spray-painting expertise of John Kretschmar)
- Thanks to our Ladies, a smart new entrance noticeboard has been procured for installation once the entranceway painting has been completed.
- Further enhancement of the garden near the 7th tee (thanks mainly to the ongoing efforts of Trevor Hughes)
- Establishing a carpark boundary line by the exit road with installation of sleepers/bollards, to be linked by draped ropes (project commenced on Monday, thanks to efforts of Jim Newlove, David Butler and yours truly)
- The long-awaited upgrade of the Ladies amenities block is expected to start shortly.

One project currently under serious consideration involves the proposed relocation of the Dotgolf and Eftpos terminals and card printer to a location outside the clubhouse, allowing access when the clubhouse is closed.

Grants

I have just compiled and submitted a grant application to the Pelorus Trust for funding towards the cost of purchasing turf seed, fertiliser and wetting agent for our course.

New Zealand Secondary Schools Final

On Sunday/Monday 1 & 2 September, the New Zealand Secondary Schools Final golf tournament will be held at our Club. This is something of an honour for Manukorihi, and will require the support each day of about a dozen volunteers as well as the provision of about 40 trundlers to be used over the two days (one round of 18 holes each day). Catering is also to be provided.

Course Equipment

Course Convenor Robin Broadmore and Course Superintendent Ryan Blackbourn continue to identify surplus course maintenance equipment items for sell-off.

Water Resource Consent

Brian Rattenbury has been leading the ongoing project applying for renewal of our water resource consent from the Taranaki Regional Council.

Incident

Finally, and regrettably, I have to report a diesel theft incident on the evening of 5 June, when the diesel storage tank just inside the course gate was broken into and an estimated 200 litres of diesel stolen. Our CCTV system recorded the vehicle used and the Police are currently investigating this crime.

Recently we had the course rating completed and the 12th and 18th are currently a little too short for being a par 5. The course rating team put recommendations forward to sort this and adjust your playing handicap accordingly.

Options are:

(1) Stay as they are, no adjustment to current rating or handicap.

(2) have 12th and 18th from current tee blocks but adjusted to par 4's this will change rating (par 70) and handicap as well over time stroke hole rating.

(3) leave 12th as is and take 18th back to par 5 distance which will be in front of current white tee block change of rating (par 71) and handicap.

It has been discussed regarding 12th going back but the expense of creating new tee block is too high and not wanting to go back over the hazard in front of white tee.
