

Answers to Trivia Questions

This week covers a scenario where the player does NOT get relief from an immoveable obstruction, even though it clearly impedes their stance or swing.

Rule 16.1 (3) No Relief When Clearly Unreasonable. There is no relief under Rule 16.1:When playing the ball as it lies is clearly unreasonable because of something from which the player is not allowed to take free relief (such as when a player is unable to make a stroke because of where the ball lies in a bush), or

• When interference exists only because a player chooses a club, type of stance or swing or direction of play that is clearly unreasonable under the circumstances.

To simplify: if the ball washer and drinking fountain were not there, could you play a normal shot. If yes, you get a drop, if not then no free drop.





For the right-handed player: The tree behind the will prevent them from taking a normal swing, therefore in this instance there is no relief from the ball washer.

For the left-handed player: The ball washer (and drinking fountain) is impeding their swing, however the tree is not therefore the left-handed player would get free relief in this instance.
