President's Report

New Zealand Secondary Schools Final

Just a reminder that our Club will be hosting the New Zealand Secondary Schools Final golf tournament on Sunday/Monday 1/2 September, with 22 teams of three players from all around the country taking part and playing one round of 18 holes each day (best two scores of three counting in each round).

This event requires the support of a dozen Club volunteers each day (lunch will be provided) as well as the provision of about 25 trundlers. Thanks to those who have already volunteered and put their names on the sheet set up on the table just inside the clubhouse door: we still need **a few more volunteers** to share the load and **another five trundlers**, so please consider if you and/or your trundler would be available. Thank you.

As always, I would like to acknowledge our dedicated band of course volunteers who, led by Course Convenor Robin Broadmore, have been putting in many hours in assisting Course Superintendent Ryan Blackbourn to ensure our course is in the best possible condition for this Golf NZ-sanctioned tournament. Apart from the usual activities such as greens maintenance, fairway mowing, roughs mowing and work on tee blocks, other activities have included a major clean-up under all the Norfolk pine trees and a general course-wide tidy-up.

Main Club Committee 2025

The 2025 main Club committee nominations form is now up on the clubhouse noticeboard ahead of the AGM. In particular, I sincerely hope that the key position of Secretary is filled for next year as it has been rather challenging operating **without a secretary** this year.

Course Superintendent's Monthly Report

For the information of members, some excerpts from Ryan Blackbourn's monthly report to the main Club committee meeting on Monday are as follows:

- Tee blocks have all been granular fertilised, with weekly sanding and seeding of divots
- Fairways still have very good cover that will hopefully put us in a very good position coming into Summer. The heights of the fairways will be raised slightly in September to cope better with the warmer temperatures through Spring and Summer
- Greens growth is slowly starting to pick up again so the number of mows per week _ will start to increase. The first verti-cut of the season has just been completed and this will become a regular activity every fortnight
- Rolling of the greens is making a big difference in firming and smoothing up the surface
- Our new Burkhart sand spreader has just been delivered and this will be a massive game-changer for the health and quality of our greens, which will start to be dusted every fortnight to start to dilute the excessive organic matter (thatch) build-up in the top 20mm of our profile
- All bunkers have been re-edged so they all now have a sharp distinct edge
- Over the last month the volunteers and myself have been very busy attending to areas on the golf course that needed a general tidy-up, including trimming around all sprinkler heads, drains and distance markers and cleaning up under all the Norfolk pine trees to improve the visual look and playability
- The shrubs in the concrete area in front of the clubhouse were removed to give a full panoramic view of the course upon arrival and to help avoid congestion of golfers and equipment in that area
- All these little jobs make the course look so much better I refer to these as the 1 per centers but they are much more than that
- Course Convenor Robin Broadmore and I really want to present the golf course to the best of its ability and with the help of our extraordinary volunteers I know we will have this course looking great!
- I (Ryan) want to personally thank everyone who has helped not only on the course but on the clubhouse as well. We are really starting to produce something pretty special here at Manukorihi that we can all be very proud of.


